Building Peace Through Music: The MY PEACE Project

A Vision Born from Hope

MY PEACE is a project created out of hope. The idea was conceived even before the war in Ukraine, as peace is always in the minds of those raised during wartime. War seems to be a persistent issue, and I remember finally shaping the constant need to talk about it into a tangible idea. I felt that the Bosnian youth had so much to say and teach, and I sensed that youth across Europe were about to face significant challenges.

War rhetoric was increasing, and young people were becoming less of a priority for policymakers, the media, and the general public. Unfortunately, my fears were validated. I wish I had been wrong. Two major wars erupted, and conflicts continued to arise. While I don't believe MY PEACE alone will stop these wars, I am convinced that young people have important contributions to make.

The Power of Music

The goal of MY PEACE is to send a message that building peace is crucial, and young people must be included in this process, especially when they are exposed to such grim realities. Our method for achieving this is through music.

Impact on Youth

Conflict, war, and extreme rhetoric rob youth of their formative years, freezing their development and marginalising them in cruel ways. Despite this, no one has asked young people what they think about the war. Our project captures this sentiment perfectly:



"MY PEACE empowers youth to be engaged in the peacebuilding process in a way that is attractive and close to youth, through the vessel of music. Music is an important part of cultural identity, and culture is one of the core elements around which understanding and empathy are needed, upon which peace can be accomplished. When we cherish and value each other's cultural heritage, we eliminate the need for conflict."

Voices of Youth

Here are some powerful statements from young people involved in the project:



"Peace must be built even when war is raging. We know that war is raging now, and all the young people hear is war." "We need to hear that someone still believes in peace and that we have the right to ask for peace." " I don't think we will stop the war with a song, but we can bring back youth at least one day, at least one young person, and that's great."

"We lose our youth in war."

The power of music as a peacebuilding avenue for youth, and the spirit of inclusion and integration through cultural activity were all in evidence when MY PEACE partners met for the first in-person Transnational Project Meeting in July in Bordeaux, France.

After many months of meeting online, this was an opportunity for partners to get to know each other better, share ideas, collaborate, and plan the next steps for the project. The meeting was hosted by Patrick Duval and Emma Asensio of project lead <u>Musique de Nuit</u>(MDN), supported by Judyth Babin of <u>Le Laba</u> and held at the <u>La Palmer de Rocher</u> in Cenon, a cultural centre and performance venue. Partners enjoyed a guided tour of the very impressive facility with informal discussions on the venue, the work of MDN, and how that related to the experiences of other partners.

Following the tour, the formal activity of the meeting began. The in-person dynamic came to life with each partner having the opportunity to report on their MY PEACE activities to date. The Partners, who came from France, Germany, Ukraine, Ireland, and Bosnia & Herzegovina shared the insights

already gleaned, and any challenges they had encountered.

The MY PEACE project aims to empower youth to become engaged in the peacebuilding process through music, in a way that appeals to our target audience of young people aged 18-30. The project will develop a Peacebuilding Approach Roadmap, to inspire and support youth educators, music, and peace stakeholders. The roadmap will be developed following research with key stakeholders and will include a methodology to explain the approach, and а compendium of good peacebuilding through music examples. The project will also produce a series of music production events and an international training event to engage young people directly and create material for a shared content portal.

By developing these resources MY PEACE will inspire young people to see themselves as agents of positivity and peace. Encouraging and supporting them to use music as a creative resource to address challenges of physical violence but also cultural and social challenges as well as issues around behaviour, relationships, and hierarchical structures that can impact integration and advancement. Using music as a tool in this innovative way provides young people with a safe, non-intimidating platform for communication and the free expression of emotions thoughts, and ideas to promote inclusion and create a sense of community and belonging. The project will also equip young people with essential social skills including communication, leadership, and empathy. Skills that are essential for resolving conflict and building lasting peace.

Meeting in person cannot be matched – the opportunities to ask questions, discuss challenges encountered, and offer each other support and suggestions to help overcome any challenges. Le

Laba also conducted a Sustainability Activity Workshop, an excellent session, with project partners collaborating in very practical and productive ways to support each other's activity. A busy and fruitful day ended with the entire group attending the <u>Festival Hauts de Garrone</u> at Bassens, organised by Musique de Nuit. An evening of networking, while listening to great bands and enjoying a range of excellent food from the multicultural food trucks at the event was a wonderful opportunity to bring the power of music to the fore.

A key element of the partner meeting was the opportunity to share our work to date and plans for the next few months with the French National Agency whose representatives attended on Day 2. It was wonderful for the continuing success of the project to get very practical feedback from the National Agency representatives. The morning meeting wrapped up with a lunch followed by an invitation for the entire consortium to attend the Palmer Block party, again music to the fore.

Partner Musique de Nuit

Musiques de Nuit is a not-for-profit association. It is responsible for the artistic project of <u>Le Rocher de</u> <u>Palmer</u>, a cultural facility created in 2010, located near Bordeaux in the heart of a working-class district where over 60 different nationalities live side by side.

Le Rocher de Palmer is a facility with 3 performance halls, devoted exclusively to music (all kinds of music), with a co-working space and a cultural business incubator.

A major cultural mediation programme has been put in place with structures in the medical, social and socio-cultural fields, etc.

The My PEACE project will be supported by Patrick Duval, the Artistic Director of Le Rocher de Palmer since 2010. He has also been the director and founder of the association Musiques de Nuit for 40 years. He is in charge of programming at Le Rocher de Palmer, but also programmes for other festivals in France.



The project is also supported Emma Asensio has been working at the Rocher de Palmer since 2021. She is responsible for concert promotion, communications and public relations. She also assists Patrick with European projects.

For us, My PEACE is an extension of another European project in 2023, G1000, during which secondary school students took part in writing workshops with Souleymane Diamanka, a poet and slammer from a working-class district of Bordeaux, who himself trained in writing workshops in the 1990s.

For My PEACE, we are calling on 4 highly motivated young people spotted by Souleymane Diamanka at G1000. For us, it's a way of showcasing the mediation work we've been doing for many years and making this essential community work visible.

For us, it will strengthen our links with the Cenon High School, which is a vocational high school, and will enable us to develop a discourse promoting the issue of peace based on texts written by young people. We are also interested in establishing links with humanitarian associations and young people, who are often far removed from these concerns.
