

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Guiding Peace and Music Workshops:

Behind the Scenes with OMK

In the MY PEACE project, <u>Outside Media &</u> <u>Knowledge</u> is the partner who guides all partners across Europe in organising meaningful music sessions.



These workshops are designed to be more than musical activities- they aim to foster dialogue, inclusion, and peacebuilding. Outside recently developed a plan to support partners on this new task, and held a presentation presenting the plan, and strategies for implementation, including detailed technical guidance for recording these sessions.

Providing Clarity and Guidance

As co-leaders of the Music Production work package, Outside Media & Knowledge developed a comprehensive work plan to help partners plan and implement their music sessions. The work plan emphasises inclusivity, encouraging partners to recruit diverse participants, including youth, musicians, and peacebuilding advocates, with special attention to Ukrainian refugees, NEETs, and those from underrepresented backgrounds. Their approach balances flexibility with a shared focus on facilitating discussions about peace, fostering intercultural exchange, and empowering youth leadership. Partners are encouraged to adapt their sessions to their local contexts while aligning with the project's broader objectives.





Outside Media & Knowledge provided partners with practical technical guidance to ensure their sessions will be well-prepared and effectively documented. This included:



Instructions for multi-angle video recording to capture engaging and dynamic footage.

Sound quality tips using affordable tools to ensure both music and dialogue are clearly recorded.



They also addressed logistical challenges, such as room arrangement for optimal recording, and offered virtual solutions for partners unable to host in-person sessions. These detailed instructions ensure that partners are equipped to begin recording highquality outputs when ready.

Looking Forward

Currently, partners are focused on recruiting participants and finalising preparations for their workshops. Once the sessions are recorded, Outside Media & Knowledge will move to the postproduction phase. They will edit and craft the recordings into engaging videos, ensuring subtitles in all partner languages for accessibility. These outputs will be powerful tools for inspiring educators, musicians, and youth to replicate similar initiatives across Europe.

As the project progresses, we are all excited to see how these videos and sessions can spark further engagement and inspire others to see music as a tool for connection and peacebuilding.

Development of Best Practice Case Studies

01 GLOMUS

A Nordic-led initiative fostering intercultural dialogue and artistic collaboration through music and performing arts. GLOMUS demonstrates how global networks, such as GLOMUS Camps, use creative expression to address global challenges, emphasizing optimism and collaboration in diverse communities.

02 Omagh Community Youth Choir (OCYC)

Established in Northern Ireland following the Omagh bombing, this choir united youth from Catholic and Protestant backgrounds to promote healing and reconciliation. By transforming trauma into music, OCYC exemplifies how shared creative spaces can build understanding across deeply divided communities.

Playing For Change (PFC)

A global multimedia initiative that connects musicians worldwide to create collaborative "Songs Around the World" and support music education in underserved communities. PFC demonstrates how music can transcend boundaries and inspire unity, making it a valuable model for cross-cultural peacebuilding.


Through the Partners' Eyes:

MOMENTUM

For over two decades, **Momentum** has been at the forefront of educational innovation in Ireland and across Europe.

Established in Leitrim, a border county in the early days of the Northern Ireland peace process and the Good Friday Agreement, they have nurtured over 50 partnerships with youth organisations, higher education institutions (HEIs) and vocational education and training (VET) providers, they work on a range of projects. These projects tackle issues including education exclusion and lack of opportunities, culture as a change agent, low-barrier entrepreneurship, social justice, sustainability, and extremist narratives. As practitioners, Momentum functions at the intersection of research, inclusion, diversity innovation, and education. Each year, they equip over six hundred learners through their sought-after classroom training courses and thousands of others through Momentum's blended learning and online courses.

MEET THE PARTNER SPIN/OKRET

Spin / Okret is a youth organisation started firstly in 2016 as an informal group of youth workers involved actively in programs and projects at the local and international levels.



Through existence as an informal group and as an organization, Okret works on developing projects, activities and methodologies involving combination of learning and active use of gained knowledge and skills. Activities of Okret are focused on young people in local communities and providing them knowledge and skills through educational trainings, exchanges, workshops and international activities.

Another important aspect of the regular activities of Okret, especially relevant to MY PEACE project, is working on innovative approaches in youth work for reconciliation, by usually using sport and art methodologies. Together in cooperation with their regular partners at the local level (such as musical schools, vocational high schools, private and public universities etc.), they are developing innovative projects combining art methodologies (such as music, photography, art therapy) in youth work settings. Youth arts work involves, by necessity and design, the collaboration of young people, youth workers and artists – and this combination of people and purpose is powerful when approached in a meaningful way.

Spin / Okret has experienced staff who have been working in the field on non-formal education and increasing competences of youth workers for the last 10 years in the Erasmus+ program and former Youth in Action program. Previous projects and local-level activities of SPIN were focused on working with young people on topics of reconciliation, peacebuilding, intercultural/interreligious dialogues and intercultural learning.

They are regularly involving youth from remote areas of their country and Herzegovina-Neretva region in their activities. Also, they are focused on providing educational training and courses for youth who are out of the school system.
